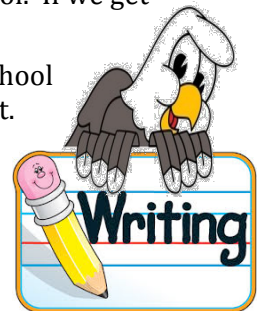

Peeking into....Grade 5

The fifth graders have been very busy since school started. They have learned about characters, setting, problem, events, and solution in the stories they have read. They have also worked on writing summaries for the stories as well. The students have written poems about the fall or school and personal narratives about what they had done on their summer vacations as well. They have also learned about writing and acting in a play since they have created the skits they will be performing on Grandparents' Day about how they see life here at St. Anthony School. The students are learning about the parts of speech, capitalization rules, punctuation rules, and types of sentences. In science, the fifth graders learned how changing variables can produce different results by experimenting with growing mold on bread in different conditions. They tested growing mold by adding more water to the bread. The students were able to grow lots of mold. They loved this "gross" experiment! They are learning about space and observing the moon and the stars at night. They recently created a Venn diagram comparing the moon and the Earth. These are just some of the many things that the fifth graders have been busy doing since school started!
