The third graders are 'rolling' through third grade at a record pace! They love our math lessons each day when we roll dice around the room to practice addition facts of two or three two-digit addends. "Math is fun!" is what I am hearing. Our Social Studies lessons are focused on the different types of communities. We will be learning about the 5 regions of the United States and how people adapt to the landforms and weather in these areas. In Religion, we are discussing the Sacraments of Christian Initiation and how our faith grows through attending church, praying, and listening to the stories about Jesus. Our kidney beans, lima beans and zinnia seeds are growing well in Science. After 6 days of observation, the zinnia seeds are over 10 centimeters long!
