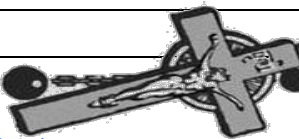

Our Blessed Virgin Mary was of course at the center of our prayer time during the month of the Rosary. Children and teachers of all grades gathered on Thursday mornings to pray a decade of the Rosary and learn about the different Mysteries. October has also been a busy month for the 4th graders focusing on the Communion of Saints. Posters and puppets were created and decorate our school walls. The 5th grade students started the year studying God's creation and how we need to care and respect each part of it. They also studied the life of some great saints as role models in their lives.
